We've had a great start to the term. I can already tell that this term is going to be very busy and just whizz by.

<u>Maths</u>

In Maths, we have started our Fractions and Decimals topic. The children are still practising their multiplication tables for homework, which is also a key component of working out Fractions. I tested the children on their Time knowledge at the end of last term, and the children all did very well. Ask them to tell you the time on different clocks and how many more minutes until the next hour. It is a hard concept to grasp that we say how many minutes <u>past</u> for the first half hour and then change and say how many minutes <u>to</u> for the second half hour. Any extra practice with this would help.

Reading

Most of the children are reading novels for the first part of this term. Novel reading relies on the children reading their specified chapter for homework, so we are all in the same place the next day. Reading novels can be tricky as the children read larger chunks of text at a time and need to recall what they've read and discuss it.

Such a good skill to master!

Writing

The children have written about their holidays this week, which is a great way for me to find out what they have been up to in the holidays in more detail.

We are moving on to studying the topic of Advertisements this term. This is a fun topic, as we look at how companies vie for our attention using different language features and marketing techniques.

Athletics

For the first few weeks of term we will be practising for the Athletic sports. I really encourage the children to try their best and compete in every event to the best of their abilities. The children will practise on Tuesday afternoons at school and we will do some practice during class time as well.

<u>Drama</u>

We have started singing practice for our school concert. The concert is around the topic of Bees this year, so we have been practising the songs and will continue to do so until the sports are over and then we will start practising the concert performance part.

Overnight Stay

Yay! We're all very excited in the Middle Class about our trip next week. A letter about this went home earlier in the week. We are going to the Otago Museum to do a Space programme, going swimming, watching the Runt movie (which was our class novel earlier in the year), staying at the camping ground at St Kilda and then going to the Art Gallery the next day.
